AUTHORITY TO LEGALLY OPERATE LOW-SPEED, UNDER-SPEED, UTILITY VEHICLE, OR MINI-TRUCK ON PUBLIC VILLAGE STREETS

Under Ohio Revised Code 4511.215, the state has granted local authority to allow under-speed, low-speed, utility vehicles, and mini-trucks to operate on a public street or highway under its jurisdiction only in areas where the posted speed limit is 35 MPH or under. These vehicles also includes golf carts and ATV vehicles.

A Packet containing ALL the below information will be provided to you. Please stop by the Municipal Building during normal business hours, Tuesday – Friday 8AM – 5PM to pick up a packet.

Below is the proper way to legally operate your vehicle on the public streets of Roseville.

- 1. Contact the police chief to schedule a date and time for your vehicle to be inspected. Inspections are provided for a \$25 fee paid to the Village Administration who will provide you with a Village Safety sticker to be displayed on your vehicle. All vehicles must meet the SAME basic standards as required by motor vehicles under Ohio Revised Code section 4513.02 Unsafe Vehicles. The vehicle will be inspected by the police and must have all the equipment installed and in working order as listed in Ohio Administrative Code 4501.30-02 Equipment to be Inspected:
 - a. Adequate brakes and braking system
 - b. Properly working brake lights, head lights, tail lights, and warning devices, also known as turn signals.
 - c. Properly working steering mechanism
 - d. A windshield to prevent injury from debris from the roadway.
 - e. Rear view mirror to reflect the operator a view of the Public Street or highway from the rear.
 - f. Appropriate tires that are free of major bumps, bulges, breaks, or any condition that would cause for unsafe conditions.
- 2. The police will inspect your vehicle for the above requirements. Upon successful inspection, the police will provide you with a signed DPS 1373 form, "Inspection Form". This will need to be sent in to the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles along with BM'V 3722 "Affidavit for Titling" if you haven't done so and BMV 3774 Form "Application for Certificate of Title" if you haven't done so either.
- 3. Once the BMV approves your forms, they will provide you with registration documentation and a license plate for display on your vehicle. NOW, you are LEGAL. Thank you!

4. WHAT ABOUT "FARM" VEHICLES AND SLOW MOVING SIGNS DISPLAYED?

ORC 4511.216 Notwithstanding sections 4511.214 and 4511.215 of the Revised Code, a person may operate a utility vehicle on any public roads or right-of-way, other than a freeway, when traveling from one farm field to another for agricultural purposes if the vehicle is displaying a triangular slow-moving vehicle emblem as described in section 4513.11 of the Revised Code.

AFFIDAVIT FOR TITLING MINI-TRUCK, UTILITY VEHICLE, AND UNDER-SPEED VEHICLE

Ohio Revised Code (R.C.) 4501.01, 4511.214 and 4511.215

INFORMATION SHEET

The Affidavit for Titling Mini-Truck, Utility Vehicle, and Under-Speed Vehicle (BMV 3722) <u>does not</u> qualify the vehicle for registration purposes, but for ownership purposes <u>ONLY</u>.

On the Certificate of Title, the vehicle will be designated as one of the following based on what is indicated on the BMV 3722:

- MT Mini-Truck, which resembles a pickup truck or van with a cargo area/bed at the rear and has four wheels, is propelled by an electric motor with a rated power of 7,500 watts or less or an internal combustion engine with a piston displacement capacity of 660 cc or less, has a total dry weight of 900 2,200 pounds, and contains an enclosed cabin and a seat for the operator.
- UV <u>Utility Vehicle</u>, which was designed with a bed, principally for transporting material/cargo in connection with construction, agricultural, forestry, grounds maintenance, lawn and garden, materials handling, or similar activities.
- **US -** <u>Under-Speed Vehicle</u> (including what is commonly known as a golf cart), which has three or four wheels, an attainable speed of not more than 20 mph, and a gross vehicle weight of less than 3,000 pounds.

If intending to use the vehicle on limited roadways in jurisdictions which allow it, the vehicle will need to be registered. An inspection from local law enforcement is required prior to applying for registration per R.C. 4511.215, O.A.C. 4501-30-01, and O.A.C. 4501-30-02. Visit ohiobmv.gov for the inspection form (DPS 1373) and additional information about unconventional vehicles.

Notwithstanding sections <u>4511.214</u> and <u>4511.215</u> of the Revised Code, a person may operate a utility vehicle on any public roads or right-of-way, other than a freeway, when traveling from one farm field to another for agricultural purposes if the vehicle is displaying a triangular slow-moving vehicle emblem as described in section <u>4513.11</u> of the Revised Code.

Section 4511.214 | Operation of low-speed, under-speed, or utility vehicle, or a mini-truck.

Ohio Revised Code / Title 45 Motor Vehicles-Aeronautics-Watercraft / Chapter 4511 Traffic Laws - Operation Of Motor Vehicles

Effective: January 1, 2017 Latest Legislation: Senate Bill 114 - 129th General Assembly

- (A)(1) No person shall operate a low-speed vehicle upon any street or highway having an established speed limit greater than thirty-five miles per hour.
- (2) No person shall operate an under-speed or utility vehicle or a mini-truck upon any street or highway except as follows:
- (a) Upon a street or highway having an established speed limit not greater than thirty-five miles per hour and only upon such streets or highways where a local authority has granted permission for such operation in accordance with section <u>4511.215</u> of the Revised Code;
- (b) A state park or political subdivision employee or volunteer operating a utility vehicle exclusively within the boundaries of state parks or political subdivision parks for the operation or maintenance of state or political subdivision park facilities.
- (3) No person shall operate a motor-driven cycle or motor scooter upon any street or highway having an established speed limit greater than forty-five miles per hour.
- (B) This section does not prohibit either of the following:
- (1) A person operating a low-speed vehicle, under-speed, or utility vehicle or a mini-truck from proceeding across an intersection of a street or highway having a speed limit greater than thirty-five miles per hour;
- (2) A person operating a motor-driven cycle or motor scooter from proceeding across an intersection of a street or highway having a speed limit greater than forty-five miles per

hour.

- (C) Nothing in this section shall prevent a local authority from adopting more stringent local ordinances, resolutions, or regulations governing the operation of a low-speed vehicle or a mini-truck, or a motor-driven cycle or motor scooter.
- (D) Except as otherwise provided in this division, whoever violates division (A) of this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. If within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to one predicate motor vehicle or traffic offense, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. If within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of two or more predicate motor vehicle or traffic offenses, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.

Section 4513.11 | Animal-drawn or slow-moving vehicles, lamps, reflectors and emblems.

Ohio Revised Code / Title 45 Motor Vehicles-Aeronautics-Watercraft / Chapter 4513 Traffic Laws - Equipment; Loads

Effective: October 16, 2009 Latest Legislation: House Bill 1 - 128th General Assembly

(A) All vehicles other than bicycles, including animal-drawn vehicles and vehicles referred to in division (G) of section <u>4513.02</u> of the Revised Code, not specifically required to be equipped with lamps or other lighting devices by sections <u>4513.03</u> to <u>4513.10</u> of the Revised Code, shall, at the times specified in section <u>4513.03</u> of the Revised Code, be equipped with at least one lamp displaying a white light visible from a distance of not less than one thousand feet to the front of the vehicle, and also shall be equipped with two lamps displaying red light visible from a distance of not less than one thousand feet to the rear of the vehicle, or as an alternative, one lamp displaying a red light visible from a distance of not less than one thousand feet to the rear and two red reflectors visible from all distances of six hundred feet to one hundred feet to the rear when illuminated by the lawful lower beams of headlamps.

Lamps and reflectors required or authorized by this section shall meet standards adopted by the director of public safety.

(B) All boat trailers, farm machinery, and other machinery, including all road construction machinery, upon a street or highway, except when being used in actual construction and maintenance work in an area guarded by a flagperson, or where flares are used, or when operating or traveling within the limits of a construction area designated by the director of transportation, a city engineer, or the county engineer of the several counties, when such construction area is marked in accordance with requirements of the director and the manual of uniform traffic control devices, as set forth in section <u>4511.09</u> of the Revised Code, which is designed for operation at a speed of twenty-five miles per hour or less shall be of the section to the director and the manual of uniform traffic control devices, as set forth in section <u>4511.09</u> of the Revised Code, which

a speed not exceeding twenty-five miles per hour, and shall display a triangular slow-moving vehicle emblem (SMV). The emblem shall be mounted so as to be visible from a distance of not less than five hundred feet to the rear. The director of public safety shall adopt standards and specifications for the design and position of mounting the SMV emblem. The standards and specifications for SMV emblems referred to in this section shall correlate with and, so far as possible, conform with those approved by the American society of agricultural engineers.

A unit of farm machinery that is designed by its manufacturer to operate at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour may be operated on a street or highway at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour provided it is operated in accordance with this section.

As used in this division, "machinery" does not include any vehicle designed to be drawn by an animal.

- (C) The use of the SMV emblem shall be restricted to animal-drawn vehicles, and to the slow-moving vehicles specified in division (B) of this section operating or traveling within the limits of the highway. Its use on slow-moving vehicles being transported upon other types of vehicles or on any other type of vehicle or stationary object on the highway is prohibited.
- (D)(1) No person shall sell, lease, rent, or operate any boat trailer, farm machinery, or other machinery defined as a slow-moving vehicle in division (B) of this section, except those units designed to be completely mounted on a primary power unit, which is manufactured or assembled on or after April 1, 1966, unless the vehicle is equipped with a slow-moving vehicle emblem mounting device as specified in division (B) of this section.
- (2) No person shall sell, lease, rent, or operate on a street or highway any unit of farm machinery that is designed by its manufacturer to operate at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour unless the unit displays a slow-moving vehicle emblem as specified in

division (B) of this section and a speed identification symbol that meets the specifications contained in the American society of agricultural engineers standard ANSI/ASAE S584 JAN2005, agricultural equipment: speed identification symbol (SIS).

(E) Any boat trailer, farm machinery, or other machinery defined as a slow-moving vehicle in division (B) of this section, in addition to the use of the slow-moving vehicle emblem, and any unit of farm machinery that is designed by its manufacturer to operate at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour, in addition to the display of a speed identification symbol, may be equipped with a red flashing light that shall be visible from a distance of not less than one thousand feet to the rear at all times specified in section <u>4513.03</u> of the Revised Code. When a double-faced light is used, it shall display amber light to the front and red light to the rear.

In addition to the lights described in this division, farm machinery and motor vehicles escorting farm machinery may display a flashing, oscillating, or rotating amber light, as permitted by section <u>4513.17</u> of the Revised Code, and also may display simultaneously flashing turn signals or warning lights, as permitted by that section.

- (F) Every animal-drawn vehicle upon a street or highway shall at all times be equipped in one of the following ways:
- (1) With a slow-moving vehicle emblem complying with division (B) of this section;
- (2) With alternate reflective material complying with rules adopted under this division;
- (3) With both a slow-moving vehicle emblem and alternate reflective material as specified in this division.

The director of public safety, subject to Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, shall adopt rules establishing standards and specifications for the position of mounting of the alternate reflective material authorized by this division. The rules shall permit, as a minimum.

alternate reflective material to be black, gray, or silver in color. The alternate reflective material shall be mounted on the animal-drawn vehicle so as to be visible, at all times specified in section <u>4513.03</u> of the Revised Code, from a distance of not less than five hundred feet to the rear when illuminated by the lawful lower beams of headlamps.

(G) Every unit of farm machinery that is designed by its manufacturer to operate at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour shall display a slow-moving vehicle emblem and a speed identification symbol that meets the specifications contained in the American society of agricultural engineers standard ANSI/ASAE S584 JAN2005, agricultural equipment: speed identification symbol (SIS) when the unit is operated upon a street or highway, irrespective of the speed at which the unit is operated on the street or highway. The speed identification symbol shall indicate the maximum speed in miles per hour at which the unit of farm machinery is designed by its manufacturer to operate. The display of the speed identification symbol shall be in accordance with the standard prescribed in this division.

If an agricultural tractor that is designed by its manufacturer to operate at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour is being operated on a street or highway at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour and is towing, pulling, or otherwise drawing a unit of farm machinery, the unit of farm machinery shall display a slow-moving vehicle emblem and a speed identification symbol that is the same as the speed identification symbol that is displayed on the agricultural tractor.

- (H) When an agricultural tractor that is designed by its manufacturer to operate at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour is being operated on a street or highway at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour, the operator shall possess some documentation published or provided by the manufacturer indicating the maximum speed in miles per hour at which the manufacturer designed the agricultural tractor to operate.
- (I) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

(J) As used in this section, "boat trailer" means any vehicle designed and used exclusively to transport a boat between a place of storage and a marina, or in and around a marina, when drawn or towed on a street or highway for a distance of no more than ten miles and at a speed of twenty-five miles per hour or less.

Section 4511.215 | Local authorization for operation of low-speed, under-speed, or utility vehicle, or a mini-truck.

Ohio Revised Code / Title 45 Motor Vehicles-Aeronautics-Watercraft / Chapter 4511 Traffic Laws - Operation Of Motor Vehicles

Effective: January 1, 2017 Latest Legislation: Senate Bill 114 - 129th General Assembly

- (A) By ordinance or resolution, a local authority may authorize the operation of underspeed or utility vehicles or mini-trucks on a public street or highway under its jurisdiction. A local authority that authorizes the operation of under-speed or utility vehicles or mini-trucks shall do all of the following:
- (1) Limit the operation of those vehicles to streets and highways having an established speed limit not greater than thirty-five miles per hour;
- (2) Require the vehicle owner who wishes to operate an under-speed or utility vehicle or a mini-truck on the public streets or highways to submit the vehicle to an inspection conducted by a local law enforcement agency that complies with inspection requirements established by the department of public safety under section <u>4513.02</u> of the Revised Code;
- (3) Permit the operation on public streets or highways of only those vehicles that successfully pass the required vehicle inspection, are registered in accordance with Chapter 4503. of the Revised Code, and are titled in accordance with Chapter 4505. of the Revised Code;
- (4) Notify the director of public safety, in a manner the director determines, of the authorization for the operation of under-speed or utility vehicles or mini-trucks.
- (B) A local authority may establish additional requirements for the operation of underspeed or utility vehicles or mini-trucks on its streets and highways.
